Funding:

- Need to build capacity in the future –Samarra Group currently assisting with funding from WRCA
- Identify Grant Writing options and who will manage those funds

Expanding Funding:

- Identifying Sources
 - o Government-legislative services
 - Federal, State, County, City, Other
 - Landowners
 - o Philanthropic-fundraising and community sources
 - o Lenders-working landscapes that can show an ROI for traditional business loans

Prioritization:

- There was a lot of discussion on whether <u>fire prevention</u> or <u>stopping the spread</u> was the highest priority. The general consensus was that fire got quick attention for "why should I care" while stopping the spread should be the overall highest priority for the GAG.
 - o Fire Hazard of the Gorse in Bandon: "The why behind the need to stop the spread of Gorse at the local level"
 - o Stop the spread
 - EDRR methods, citizen science projects and information to the public
- Land for productive usage
- Wildlife conservation programs
- Who will manage the data?

Next Steps Action Plan:

- Expanding our FireWise communities
- Identifying capacity needs and expanding appropriate support
- Identifying who is at the table and tallying the hours that the group is putting in for **matching** needs for future grants, i.e. in-kind funding credit.
- Documentation of demonstration projects to help make the case for increasing capacity and funding
- Workforce housing in Gorse infested areas such as the Donut Hole through land reclamation development
