Erin M.	Welcome & intros	<ul> <li>Around the room introductions.</li> <li>Moment of silence for victims of fires.</li> </ul>
Celeste L.	Presentation: Strategic Revegetation Strategies Following Gorse Treatments  Begins at minute: 0:08:50	<ul> <li>Elaiosome (fat body on seed) creates a vector of spread through ant activity. Seeds viable 30-70+ years.</li> <li>Revegetation with natives after gorse removal builds resiliency in ecosystem.</li> <li>Locally adapted stock is better suited to local climate, but availability is low.</li> <li>How local is appropriate? Varies by species, can't generalize.</li> <li>Local collection of seeds to supplement purchased stock is a good approach.</li> <li>No good source of information on genetics of forbs, limited research on grasses.</li> <li>See list of well-regarded producers in pdf.</li> </ul>

Presentation: Ocean Shores Begins at minute: 0:49:05	<ul> <li>OPRD has a recreational easement (Ocean Shores) from extreme low tide to the Statutory Vegetation Line (SVL) or line of established upland vegetation (EUV) whichever is further inland, managed for public access.</li> <li>If permits are needed if the following activities are proposed within the Ocean Shores easement; vegetation cutting or removal, vehicle travel, shore protection, etc.</li> <li>Permits process is designed to limit damage to the easement, beach access, infrastructure, wildlife, cultural resources, and private property.</li> <li>Type of vegetation to be controlled, ie noxious weeds, is irrelevant to the need for a permit.</li> <li>See presentation pdf for more specifics and resources.</li> </ul>
Jessica L.	Regional Solutions	<ul> <li>Jessica is our area's Regional Solutions contact for the Governor's office. They are the economic and community development arm.</li> <li>Is available to help with community gorse projects.</li> </ul>
Liza E.	Presentation: Sunset Cove  Begins at minute: 1:37:32	<ul> <li>Liza gave a presentation to the City of Bandon with an overview of the Districting plan. They are making great progress with ~50 % voluntary control happening.</li> <li>Letters of Support were received from Coquille Indian Tribe, US FWS, and private landowners.</li> <li>One in District 3 is very complex requiring coordination on a lot of levels. Steep slopes, Ocean Shores, and private and public properties.</li> </ul>
